- Indiana Michigan Power Company requests that the Michigan Public Service Commission (Commission) grant approval of its integrated resource plan.
- This notice of public hearing describes how a person may participate in this public hearing. The intent of this hearing is to inform the public about Indiana Michigan Power Company's application, the Commission's role, timeline, and the administrative process to be followed in <u>Case No. U-21189</u>. The public hearing will be legislative in nature and any person may present data and views regarding the application during the public comment period.

Public Comment for the Public Hearing:

Members of the public who wish to make a comment may do so during the public comment portion of the hearing, subject to the following requirements. Comments should be limited to no longer than three (3) minutes; however, the presiding officer will manage the public comment process and may adjust or place further limits on how long a person may speak.

Public comments must be directed to the Commission and should not be used to engage with other participants or respond to their comments. The public comment period is an opportunity for commissioners to listen to comments and concerns and not to answer questions. Public comments should be limited to one per person.

Please note that you can only make verbal comments during this public hearing by calling into the hearing using the phone number and conference ID identified in this notice.

This feature is available on the right-hand side of the control bar next to the mute button.

Public Comments via Phone

After taking up comments from those that have pre-registered or registered through the Q&A feature, the ALJ will then provide an opportunity for comment from individuals who were unable to pre-register and who are participating by phone but not utilizing the online Q&A feature.

When it is your turn to speak, press *6 on your phone to unmute. Please indicate your name, and where you live if you are willing to share, so we have that information for our records and limit your comment to no longer than 3 minutes, so we have a chance to hear from all who would like to comment.
